MINUTES – MAY 26, 2022
SANITARY DISTRICT COMMISSION MEETING

The May 2022 meeting of the Bohner's Lake Sanitary District Commission was held on Thursday, May 26, 2022 at 5:00 PM virtually via WebEx at 1-408-792-6300 Meeting ID 2594 280 4707#. Present at the virtual meeting were Commissioners Harvey Kandler, Carrie Oldenburg; and Jess Wiskes; District Accountant/Admin Ruth DeLay; Attorney Rich Scholze; District Secretary Denise Rintz; Dave Pfanzerter from the lake committee and Tyler Gates of Baxter & Woodman.

1. **Approval of Meeting Minutes from April 28, 2022 Meeting:** Kandler/Oldenburg motioned to approve the minutes of the April 28, 2022. Motion passed unanimously.
2. **BLMC:** We have a large invasion of curly leaf. We will have Wisconsin Lake & Ponds visit again next week with Dave Pfanzerter to take a look at an additional treatment in the overgrowth areas. Dave was contacted by several lakeshore homeowners who were concerned about not having ASDA picking up the lake weeds as we have done in previous years. This will be a discussion point at the BLMC meeting next week Thursday. Harvey received a call from a homeowner who lives around the Contour Drive area who stated that there were hundreds of geese around the shoreline and beach area and was concerned about this issue. Dave said he would contact the homeowner to discuss further. Ruth mentioned that we need to move funds from the general checking account into the BLMC checking account for summer projects that are scheduled. A motion was made and carried unanimously to transfer \$30,000 into the BLMC checking account.
3. **Mitigation Field:** Harvey met with Shoreline Company. They manage the shoreline projects at 8081 Lakeshore Drive. Harvey discovered that they will be a helpful resource with our streambank restoration project. Dave spoke with Heidi at the DNR to discuss the possibility of applying for grant money for our projects. He will keep us posted on his progress.
4. **8081 Lakeshore Drive:** The riprap around the shoreline and the shoreline plantings has been damaged from the muskrats in the area. Harvey spoke with Shoreline Company about the repairs that need to be made. They will come up with a price for both rock and shoreline repairs. Harvey also spoke with Augie's about adding base gravel to the driveway as several service trucks will be using that area for parking when conducting work for the district. Judy Pieters will be managing the garden beds and plantings again this year.
5. **Lift Stations/Sanitary System Updates:** We had an issue with lift station 10. There was rubber gloves and fabric stuck in the pumps. We will have the power turned off for a period of time tomorrow to make the repairs. Wanasek will be making the repairs. Lift station 3 had an issue with the backflow valves. Joe from Wanasek will try to get it up and running before the weekend as he has the parts to make the repairs.
6. **Baxter & Woodman Project Updates:** Reviewing and making calculations for the treatment agreement. Jacob's Smokehouse was calculated at 1 RE which may not be correct. Rich will look into that. 2021 sewer cleaning report is completed and there were two manholes that had leaking seals. There is a chimney seal that also needs repair. One manhole is covered with pavement which we may need to add to the Highway P project. There is a pipe sag that was found which was not present in the previous years' videos. It is located at White Oak Drive in a right of way close to where a tree had fallen. This might be the cause of the sag. We will
